#### **EVENT FORMAT:**

- Each Semi Final will be hosted by Future Anything's Nicole Dyson with three independent judges selecting the winners.
- Nic will hand over to your team when it's your turn to pitch. Each team will give a 3-minute live pitch then face c. 5 minutes of questions from the judges. You can use PowerPoint slides. These MUST be submitted in advance (see page 5). Teams will only be on screen during their own pitch/Q&A but can watch the rest of the event via the Zoom link.
- The judges will announce a winner and a runner up at the end of each of the Semi Finals. The online audience will choose their **People's Vote winner** via a live poll, so be sure to rally support for your team and organise a Watch Party at your school (see page 10 for ideas!).
- All students much have a parent/caregiver complete and return the <u>Media Release Form</u> (PDF) here no later than Thursday 19 October.

#### **EVENT PLATFORM & ACCESS:**

- A Teams will pitch using Zoom live from your own school. Teachers MUST ensure Zoom is enabled by your school network and you have a suitable laptop/computer and stable internet connection prior to the event starting. More info on tech set up recommendations can be found on page 8.

### About Your Pitch & Presentation

#### Q. HOW LONG SHOULD OUR PITCH BE?

You have **3 minutes** (max) to pitch your innovative, scalable and sustainable idea to the panel. Out of respect for other teams, please stay to time. You will hear a bell at the end of 3 minutes, and you WILL be cut off if you go over time. We recommend you practice your pitch to ensure you're under the limit.

#### Q. WHAT SHOULD WE COVER IN OUR PITCH?

The rubric the judges will be using is here (PDF). This is what they're interested in:

- Innovation What problem is the idea solving? Why does this problem matter? Is your solution original or has it been done before? Why is your idea different to others?
- Impact will your idea really make a difference? Is there potential for it to scale and grow? Is the idea sustainable? How will you measure your impact?
- **Implementation** how will the idea happen? Is it realistic? Have you thought about things like budgets/timelines/risks? How will you make money?

#### Q. CAN WE USE SLIDES? Yes (but no video) – please ensure you read the following info carefully:

- All slides must be created in PowerPoint Widescreen (16:9) mode
- Do not include video, transitions or multiple builds within a slide. Text should be 20pt minimum

- Slides submitted after this date will not be accepted.
- Please ensure your slides are clearly labelled with both your Team and School Name
- Slides will be controlled by the Webinar Host presenters must say 'next slide' to change.

#### Q. WHO ARE THE JUDGES? ARE THEY SCARY?

You can see the Semi Finals judges <u>here.</u> But no, they're not scary! They are all interesting humans who are passionate about new business ideas & supporting emerging entrepreneurs. They've all had successes, but also failures and they want to support you, the next generation of Aussie changemakers.

#### Q. WHAT DO WE WIN?

- The **WINNER** of each Semi Final will progress to pitch live (in person or online) at the National Grand Final on Monday 20 November in Brisbane.
- The **RUNNER UP** of each Semi Final will progress to showcase (i.e. exhibit) at the National Grand Final.
- One **PEOPLE'S VOTE** winner from the Semi Finals will receive a wildcard to progress to showcase (i.e. exhibit) at the National Grand Final.

All teams in the National Grand Final will be in with a chance of winning funding and support to launch their businesses into the real world.

## Pitch Mentoring & Tech Check Sessions

#### 20 MINUTE PITCH MENTORING SESSION

Every team can access their own 20-minute mentoring session with the Future Anything team.

#### **TECH CHECK DROP IN**

There is a 'Tech Check Drop In' session for all pitching teams on Tuesday 17 October. Our friendly AV Technician, Andrew, will be on hand to help throughout the Drop In session. You will only need to drop in for 5-10 minutes.

This gives teams and/or teachers a chance to check your Zoom access, make sure your slides, audio and video work and that the audience will be able to hear/see you properly.

## Zoom, Tech & Room Set Up Info

IMPORTANT: If you have team with several team members, you should all be together on one Zoom connection (i.e. don't use a separate individual Zoom connection for each team member).

#### **ZOOM SET UP/PRE-REQUISITES & RECOMMENDATIONS**

- Use of a **laptop** or **desktop computer** is strongly recommended. It will need to have the latest version of the Zoom Desktop Client / Mobile App installed and tested.
- Broadband internet connection 2.5Mbps up/down minimum is recommended (closing other applications, and pausing file sharing apps such as Dropbox/Google Drive/OneDrive can assist in creating a more stable connection). Use a wired internet connection if you can, it's more reliable than WIFI or mobile.
- Ensure your camera and mic are recognised by the software:

#### How to test audio / How to test video

- Ensure your screen view is set to "gallery view" for the duration of the event
- Click the arrow next to the "Start/Stop Video" button to access Zoom's video settings and select: Hide non-video participants.
- TIP: if you have been running Microsoft Teams on your computer, you may need to shut Teams down completely to release their camera and mic for Zoom to use.

Do not share the Zoom link provided with classmates or family. This is for pitching teams only. Check out details in the 'Watch Parties' section below for details of how your supporters can watch the event live on YouTube.

You will only be on screen when it is your turn to pitch. Our AV technician (Andrew) will upgrade your team to 'presenter' status when it is your turn to pitch. He may ask you to switch on your camera/mic so be sure to listen for instructions.

#### PITCHING ROOM SET UP RECOMMENDATIONS

- Set up your 'pitching room' in advance this could be a quiet classroom or space away from noise or distractions.
- Your pitching room should have good, reliable internet access.
- Make sure you are in a quiet, well-lit area and that the camera is at eye level and has a wide enough angle to capture your whole team.
- Avoid having any bright light behind your team (i.e. windows, lamps etc)
- Think about our backdrop could you show your business and/or school logo? Have you got a
  prototype or image of your product or service?
- In you have classmates watching the event live, they should be in a different room to ensure best quality sound.

## Watch Parties & Rallying Support

All Semi Finals will be broadcast live online so your everyone can watch and support their favourite team. There will be a live *People's Vote* in all of the Semi Finals, so the more supporters you have watching, the more likely you are to win this award! The link for the People's Vote will be provided at the end of the pitches as the judges 'leave the room' to deliberate.

Here are three ways to get your supporters on board:

#### 1. ORGANISE A WATCH PARTY AT YOUR SCHOOL

Work with your teacher to arrange for your classmates or students from across your school to watch your Semi Final live together and barrack for you! Your watch party could be set up in a classroom or school hall (it will need to be separate from your pitch room so it's quiet).

If your classmates have access to an internet connected device, they'll also be able to support your team in the live online People's Vote.

#### 2. BUILD YOUR ONLINE SUPPORT TEAM

Anyone, anywhere in the world, can watch your Semi Final live online on YouTube to support you and (importantly) to vote for you in the People's Vote!

#### 3. GO WILD ON SOCIAL MEDIA

There are social tiles for you to use across your own <u>socials in Google Drive here</u>. Talk to your teacher about whether your team can be promoted on your school's social channels.

Why not record a sixty second video explaining your idea and why you should win and have your school post it on their socials?

Make sure your 'ask' in your posts/video is that people register for a free ticket to tune in to watch your Semi Final so they can vote for you in the People's Vote.
